ENGAGE

- 1. Have you ever believed an adage (the early bird gets the worm; slow and steady wins the race; better safe than sorry)? Share about an adage familiar to you. What does it mean? Where did you hear it first? Is it true?
- 2. Read Acts 15:8-11. What is the significance of God "knowing the heart"? What evidence of faith did Peter point to in verse 8? What does Peter contend to be true regarding Jews and Gentiles?
- **3.** What is the Truth about salvation that Peter states in verse 11? How does God's Grace help us understand what should be at the core of a Jesus-following belief system?
- **4.** Share about a time when there was a phrase that gave you hope. What were the circumstances and how did the phrase that came to mind inspire you? (Example: "If I can get through this, I can handle anything; I've put in the hard work, the 'event' will be easy in comparison.")
- 5. Why are memorable phrases inspirational? How can a Creed inspire faith?
